

ANGUS NZ/COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM OUTLINE





Brief

The successful applicant will embark on an internship at Colorado State University as part of a joint venture with the University and AngusNZ. The internship is a paid position starting January 2025 and runs for a 6 month period. (approx.)

The successful applicant needs to be aware that they are an ambassador of AngusNZ and need to identify how they would strengthen and grow the concept and relationship between the two organizations AngusNZ and Colorado University.

Outline of Internship (TBC)

- On Farm hand at CSU research farm in Wyoming involves, winter feeding, cow monitoring, calving heifers/cows, calf health monitoring, PAP and Breeding soundness exam of bulls in preparation for the April Bull Sale, heifer pelvic and PAP measuring, Spring hay preparation, synchronization & AI of heifers.
- Shared on farm accommodation provided (does not include personal spending ie grocieries)
- Visits to the National Western Stock show in Denver American Angus in St Joseph.
- processing at the university farm where feed intake & methane measurements are taken.

Eligibility

- The representative must have a strong interest in the Beef Cattle Industry, be open minded to future opportunities and changes within the Beef industry.
- Must be over 18 years of age and have a mature, professional, positive attitude.
- Must become a registered member of Generation Angus on return.

Conditions of Entry

- Flights ex CHCH/Auckland/Wellington
- Availability for the given period of the scholarship timeframe as outlined.
- Have a valid passport
- Travel cannot be exchanged for cash or other items
- Candidates must be available for interview face to face
- Behave in an appropriate manner that does not put AngusNZ in disrepute, if the attendee's behavior does put Angus NZ into disrepute a full refund of all costs will be required by the exchange recipient.
